### **1 Clinician Scientist Position**

CRC1160: Immune-mediated pathology as a consequence of impaired immune reactions (IMPATH).

**The programme will start in January 2020.**

The aim of this structured qualification programme is to provide optimal support to a clinician who is undergoing medical specialist training and who has a clear interest in scientific research focused on immunology. The long-term goal is to develop a young physician-scientist group leader for an integration into the CRC. The programme is designed as a three-year programme supported by mentors at a clinical institution with academic leadership at the Medical Center - University of Freiburg. An agreed percentage of working hours (50 %) is allocated exclusively for research.

The scientific project has to be connected to one of the projects of the CRC 1160 ([www.sfb1160.uni-freiburg.de](http://www.sfb1160.uni-freiburg.de)). The 50% scientific work conducted by the Clinician Scientist is financed by the CRC 1160 for 3 years. The respective supervising department commits to finance the Fellow's clinical work throughout the programme.

**The programme contains three key components:**

- an excellent scientific research programme (including protected time for research)
- a continuous mentoring and qualification programme
- an innovative leadership training programme

**Your electronic application must include:**

- the application form (**please request from the coordination office**) with CV and list of publications as attachments
- a letter of motivation
- copies of medical degree, German license to practice, and doctoral degree certificate
- project outline designed for three years. (The project must be prepared in collaboration with a project leader of the CRC.) **Please read the instructions in the information sheet, which has to be requested from the coordination office.**
- signed declaration of support by the director of the clinical department with confirmation of co-financing (50% clinical work) release from patient-care responsibilities (50% over the 3 year period), confirmation regarding the aims and state of the applicant's medical specialist training and confirmation regarding the necessary infrastructure for conducting research
- letter of support from the scientific and clinical mentors
