The Faculty of Medicine and the Medical Center - University of Freiburg are offering within the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF)-funded Advanced Clinician Scientist (ACS)-Program IMMediate (Immune-Mediated Diseases; speaker: Prof. Robert Thimme)

3 Advanced Clinician Scientist Positions for 3 Departments/Institutes within the Medical Center - University of Freiburg

The program will start in May 2024.

The aim of this structured qualification program is to provide optimal support to board certified physicians who have a clear interest in scientific research focused on immunology. The program is designed as a six-year program and contains the following key components:

- excellent research environment shaped by world-leading scientists
- flexible and protected combination of basic or clinical research time (50%), teaching and health care
- funding of direct project costs / personal costs (e.g. for technical assistance or PhD students) / travel funds and more
- participation in an integrative and interdisciplinary network of ACS at comparable career stages
- integration into the internationally visible research profile on immune-mediated diseases
- access to cutting-edge technology platforms, core facilities, clinical study center, data management facilities and biobanks
- an individual qualification, coaching and mentoring program
- integration into a structured academic career pathway with active involvement in training and further education of medical students and clinician scientists
- scientific and clinical independence with a perspective for a permanent position in academic medicine

Participation in the program is possible in part-time.

The program aims to support Advanced Clinician Scientists

- who have a proven research profile in immunology which is consistent with the goals of the host department/institute,
- who lead or are currently building up a scientific working group,
- who have already completed their habilitation, have obtained their habilitation maturity or habilitation is in other ways already foreseeable,
- who have successfully applied for their own third-party-funds,
- who have completed their medical specialty training (board-certified) and preferably already have a clinical leadership position, e.g. (Functional) Senior Physicians and
- who have a clear at least medium-term perspective at the Medical Center University of Freiburg.

Additionally, previous participation in a formal Clinician Scientist-Program or scientific training abroad will be advantageous.

A complete application consists of the following two parts:

- 1. Departments and institutes with researchers working on the topic of immune-mediated diseases are asked to submit a 2-page application for an ACS position. In this application, the department director and, if applicable, a relevant IMMediate researcher (PI associated with IMMediate, see also "IMMediate associated departments/institutes" on the IMMediate website) must
 - specify how the ACS will be integrated into the department and in how far he or she will extend the clinical and scientific activities of the department,
 - broadly define the relevant research areas of the applicant and explain how they are linked to the clinical focus of the department (e.g. major patient cohorts) and
 - delineate a framework for the career development of the ACS, elaborating how scientific independence is guaranteed and supported.

Furthermore, the application must include long-term career endpoints such as head of a clinical section and/or the appointment of a professorship.

2. Potential ACS candidates are asked to submit their application for an ACS position. Further details on the application requirements are set out in the information sheet, which must be requested together with the application form at the IMMediate Coordination Office (immediate@uniklinik-freiburg.de).

The Selection Committee can only assess applications from potential ACS candidates, if the respective department / institute has also submitted an application.

The required applications must <u>each</u> be submitted <u>as a single pdf file</u> by **November 10**th, **2023, 12:00 (noon) CET** to the IMMediate coordination office (<u>immediate@uniklinik-freiburg.de</u>).
